

15	7	Warning letter sent home which MUST be signed and returned, and meeting with Assistant Principal
20	10	Notification to Office of District Attorney of truancy

18 abs/20 tardies: removal from Promise Academy or mandatory retention.

Attendance Statistics

- All children, regardless of socio-economic background, do worse academically in 1st grade if they are chronically absent (missing 10 percent or more of school including excused and unexcused absences) in kindergarten.
- A recent study in California found that only 17 percent of children chronically absent in both kindergarten and 1st grade were proficient readers by the end of 3rd grade as compared to 64 percent of their peers who attended regularly(missing less than 5 percent of school.)
- Going to school regularly in the early years is especially critical for children living in poverty, who are less likely to have the resources to make up for lost time in the classroom.
- Among impoverished children, chronic absence in kindergarten predicts the lowest levels of educational achievement at the end of 5th grade


The following students are exempt from 3rd grade retention:











Transportation: Car Line

Arrival

- · 7:30-8:00 am

Arrival

 - > 2:23 (F)

Title I/Federal Programs

- Receive Federal funding to support academic programs (Reading & Math intervention/Co-teachers)
- Teachers are licensed
- Rights to have proper notice
- School accountability

Title I: Parental Involvement Opportunities

- All meetings -in person
- > 2 meetings per quarter
- Notification by email, kickboard/class dojo, letter, and phone
- Parent representative at all SIP meetings



Medication

- Over –the- Counter medicine is strictly prohibited. (cough drops, throat lozenges, aspirin, etc.)
- All prescription medications must be brought to the office.
- Student must have a medical authorization form completed by his/her Pediatrician authorizing medication at school.
- Only authorized personnel can dispense medication. (Nurse, Office personnel)

ASTHMA

- Student must have Asthma for on file in the office.
- Must be kept under lock and key.
- Cannot carry medication on person w/o notification of need from Pediatrician.
- Parent must complete Asthma Plan: provides in detail parent specifications for school personnel in the event student has attack. (take two breaths of inhaler twice, wait for 5 minutes before calling Parent)
- School Nurse will contact parents w/in the 1st month of school
- Need additional assistance see Mrs. Morris
